

## [ WHAT WE DO ]

Since 2013, **SSCh** has been active in various humanitarian contexts, intervening directly or in partnership with international associations that manage local projects. We have provided our help in Turkey, Jordan, Iraq, Lebanon, Syria, Romania, Greece, the Balkans, and now in Gaza and Madagascar.

### **REFUGEE CAMP SUPPORT PROJECT**

In Turkey, home to over half of the 6 million displaced Syrians, we assist more than 900 families and 6,000 people with support for orphans, food supplies, medical care, education, and emergency management.

### **POST-EARTHQUAKE PROJECT IN SYRIA**

Following the earthquake in Syria on February 6, 2023, we support 150 families across three camps, providing water, food, and blankets. We support over 650 individual cases of newborns to whom we deliver powdered milk in response to malnutrition and provide medical care where necessary. We support more than 150 orphan families, managing an assistance and listening office.

### **AL-RESALA PEDIATRIC CLINIC**

The clinic at Al-Resala, staffed by two doctors and a nurse, provides free care; if inaccessible, we reach patients with an equipped medical vehicle.

### **AMAN PROJECT**

Aman offers a safe space for Syrian women, providing support and training to 280 women, 360 girls, and 90 children.

### **MADAPROJECT, ONE DROP AT A TIME**

In Madagascar, we have been providing drinking water since 2023 and plan to build water infrastructure and promote sustainable agricultural practices.

### **GAZA, HELP NOW**

In response to the emergency in Rafah, we provide vital aid focused on children, distributing nutritious meals and planning the installation of water tanks.

## [ WHO WE ARE ]

**Support and Sustain Children - SSCh** - is a small Italian Non-Profit organization based in Verdellino, in the province of Bergamo. It is the realization of a humanitarian commitment that began in 2013 by the will of **Arianna Martini**, the founder of the association, which operated as a purpose committee until 2017.

**SSCh** is directly engaged in refugee camps that have formed along the Turkish-Syrian border where thousands of people, families, and children fleeing the war that broke out in Syria in 2011 have gathered. The main beneficiaries of SSCh's humanitarian action are children, especially orphans.

## [ WHERE WE OPERATE ]

Not all refugee camps are the same. Most are places recognized by the host state authorities, organized and monitored with the support of international NGOs and recipients of aid and funds.

**SSCh**, however, intervenes in unrecognized contexts, defined as spontaneous refugee camps. These realities remain invisible, ignored, and do not receive any kind of support. They are places that do not even offer basic living conditions. They lack everything: food, drinking water, health care and medicines, clothing, tents, education. The children pay the highest price.

## [ HOW WE INTERVENE ]

SSCh, thanks to the support and trust of donors who believe in the work of the organization, collects funds to purchase and distribute on-site, on a regular basis:

- Food supplies to each individual family, the elderly, and children
- Construction and maintenance of drinking water wells
- Powdered milk for the youngest and most defenseless
- Clothing to cope with the winter cold
- Blankets and mattresses
- Field tents to provide a more stable and secure shelter
- Firewood to ensure winter heating
- Medicines and medical assistance
- Basic education for children of school and preschool age
